IT'S mini-SHOW TIME!

April is show month, and although we won't have the big two-day public show this year, we still plan on showing off the rhododendrons blooming in our gardens.

We're calling it a mini-show and it will be held **Thursday, April 21**, during our regular meeting at the church. (Please note that is the third Thursday this month, not the fourth.)

And to encourage everyone to attend and participate we're inviting everyone who attends to help judge the show and **we're handing out some cash**.

Blue-ribbon in each of the nine categories will win \$25 cash awards and the Best of Show award will include a \$100 gift certificate to Moonstone Grill.

The show will be judged by everyone. You'll get a ballot on which to indicate your choice for top honors in each category. A second ballot will determine the Best of Show award.

Rules for the show are simple: You can enter one truss in each category (that means a maximum of nine entries per member). Trusses only. No sprays or hammerheads. Rhododendrons only. No azaleas. You can clean 'em up by removing all but one whorl of leaves, washing the leaves with water only (no milk, leaf polish or other detergents) and removing loose bracts and other junk that tends to fall down between the flowers.

We'll have bottles at the church to display the flowers, but out of deference to the carpet and the time needed to fill and empty the bottles, they won't contain water. So, after cutting your flowers, place them in warm water until it's time to transport them to the church; that will keep them in good shape for the couple of hours we'll need to complete the show.

The nine categories are:

- Class 1: Lepidote Rhododendron Species, regardless of color. (These include the Maddeniis and most small-leafed rhododendrons.)
 - Class 2: Elepidote Rhododendron Species, regardless of color.
 - Class 3: Hybrid Rhododendrons, Red.
 - Class 4: Hybrid Rhododendrons, Pink.
 - Class 5: Hybrid Rhododendrons, White.
 - Class 6: Hybrid Rhododendrons, Purple, lavender or blue.
 - Class 7: Hybrid Rhododendrons, Yellow, orange or apricot.
 - Class 8: Hybrid Rhododendrons, Bicolor.
- Class 9: Any Rhododendron truss entered for fragrance. (You can enter a truss from a plant already entered in another class for this one. If you enter a Mi Amor in the white (Class 5), you also can enter a Mi Amor truss in this class.)

If you have questions give me a call at 822-6580 (e-mail: jerry_reynolds@cox.net). I'll have entry tags at the show, along with my copy of *Greer's Guidebook* to help with classification if necessary. Everyone should have something in bloom now, so grab the shears and share it with the rest of us. It should be fun evening without the stress of the big show. *By, Jerry Reynolds*

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Martin at 7:35 p.m. Twenty-five members were present. No new members or guests were present. Trusses were shared by Don Wallace, Nova Cramer, Nelda Palmer and Jim Wasetis. Don Wallace described the raffle plants. In the absence of treasurer Tim Walsh, Bruce Palmer reported a balance of \$8,343.53. The drop from the previous month is due to purchase of **plants for the sale**April 16th and 17th. No correspondence was reported.

The flower show this year will be a **members' show at the April 21** meeting chaired by Jerry Reynolds. Rules for the show were discussed by Jerry (see page one for complete rules). He urged everyone to bring trusses for the nine categories. The April meeting will be devoted entirely to the show with members as judges.

Don Wallace has arranged a **public garden tour to be held April 17**. Nine gardens will be open to the public at a fee of \$10 per person. June Walsh has distributed tickets to various garden centers in the area. Members were asked to volunteer to serve as docents at the gardens. Those who do will be able to tour the gardens on Saturday. The plant sale will be held Saturday, April 16 and Sunday, April 17 at Trinoskey's home.

Before the break, Don gave a thorough mini-program on fragrant Rhododendrons with slides of all major species and many hybrids. Following the break, Don Wallace introduced Dee Daneri as guest speaker. Dee gave an excellent and detailed program about how to prepare trusses for a show and how to judge them. Dee advocated establishing a standard system of judging throughout ARS.

Phil O'Hay won the door prize. The Raffle yielded \$64. Don raffled a specimen of R. "Honey Butter" for \$25. Tom thanked everyone for attending and adjourned the meeting at 9:20 p.m.
