Dee is on the corner on your right.

Return to Country Club Estates Drive, slight left onto Mill Street, turn right on Rohner-ville Road (Main Street), go about 1.7 miles, turn right on Newburg Road, turn left on Franklin Avenue, turn left on Boyden, Sue and Everett are on the right.

#### Plant of the Month

Rhododendron 'Black Magic': If you are looking for a plant that has great foliage, a nice mounding plant habit, and rich dark red flowers, then R. 'Black Magic' should be on your wish list. After 10 years, our plant is 6 ft. wide and 4 ft. tall and covers itself with piles of black-red blooms in early May. It is one of our most popular reds and will really glow when the afternoon sun is backlighting the flowers. Hybridized by Harold Greer, of Greer Gardens in Eugene, Oregon, and registered in 1988, it is a cross between R. 'Jean Marie de Montague' and R. 'Leo'. Plant R.

'Black Magic' with rhododendrons that have white or light pink flowers to create a contrast that will stop traffic. Congratulations to Harold Greer for creating such a wonderful rhododendron hybrid.

#### Make a Tufa Pot at the Potluck!

Use of stone troughs as plant containers began in England in the 1920's as cast iron enameled sinks were replacing stone ones. Gardeners realized that these stone receptacles were ideal to use as planters. A collection of small plants, arranged artfully, made an attractive addition to the garden. Small rhododendrons like R. radicans, dwarf conifers and selected sedum can be used successfully in troughs.

Few of us have stone sinks so hyper-tufa pots have been made for many years to replicate the look of stone.

#### Ryan's Recipe

The Chapter will provide the ingredients to make the tufa:

2 parts peat

1 part construction sand

1 part Portland cement

#### What YOU need to bring:

- Plastic or rubber gloves to handle the cement mixture.
- A container in which to make your trough. (10 inches wide x 12 inches long x 6 inches deep is a good starter size). Sturdy cardboard boxes, old dishpans or turkey roasters (not one you will use in the kitchen), plastic pots, all work well.
- An old broom stick, broken shovel handle or other tool for tamping the material.
- A strong plastic garbage bag in which to take you project home. It will need to dry
  for about a week in the bag.
- A good sense of humor and a little imagination.
